Cannington Yarn Bombers

The group is going strong, meeting on Tuesday mornings at the URC in the upstairs area. We are very grateful to the URC church for allowing us to use this space and as a small thank you we donated the money raised from our

Cannington Christmas stall to the church. Many of you will have seen the Christmas tree made from a variety of green squares. After Christmas the squares were repurposed and made into blankets which were donated to local charities. Our next project was to make bollard toppers to help celebrate the village pantomime.





Alongside, we have worked on the two panels which will form part of a D Day Commemorative project in Normandy called "The Longest Yarn". Some of you will have seen our work which was displayed before Easter. The first, shows the camp of US 535th AAA camped at Brymore House and the second, the battalion shipping out through a representation of the brook area of the village. We were allowed a

photo shoot in front of Brymore Academy with our panel. This matched the old photographs we based our work on. The open events were attended by many villagers including some of the Brymore Academy pupils and the Brownies. We appreciated the professional photography from Jeff Talbot at both events.

The panels are now safely delivered to France where they are waiting to be exhibited along with 78 others at Notre Dame Cathedral, Carentan, from May to August. The work then starts a tour of the UK. It is hoped that we will see it in Wells Cathedral at the end of this year if all goes to plan. We have loaned the poppy cascades to The Longest Yarn. The first is now on display festooned on the house where the panels are being stored and the project worked on.

Our next plans remain a secret so keep a look out around the village

When The Americans came to Cannington

The US Army, 535th Anti-Aircraft Artillery (AAA) Battalion were stationed in Cannington from late February to the end of May 1944. Their billet was Brymore House, now Brymore Academy with most of the men camping with tents in front of the house and around the side onto Cannington Park.

When Cannington Yarn Bombers volunteered to represent this as part of the D-Day Commemorative project "The Longest Yarn" we were very grateful to John Edney who as a child here in 1944, remembered the camp and had also helped veterans from the 535th visit the village so had memories of their time here. John lent us a book written by the 535th from their memories, diaries and letters. This is a short history of the time spent by the US 535th AAA in our village.

The 535th AAA was formed in 1942 at a Camp MAAR (Mojave Anti-Aircraft Artillery Range) in a vast desert area, 35 miles from Death Valley. The Battalion had around 800 men and 39 officers at that time and the 40mm gun was their main weapon. It fired 120 rounds per minutes and each shell was fused to explode on impact with any part of a plane. The 535th knew that their jobs would be to defend strategic points such as airfields and troop concentrations against dive bombing planes and low level bombers.

The soldiers saw the New York skyline for the first time as they went on the ferry boat to their transatlantic ship, The Duchess of Bedford. They were on the ship in harbour for 2 days, before finally sailing on February 11th 1944. They arrived in Greenock, Scotland 11 days later on 22nd February.

They were immediately sent through to the station and loaded onto a train that would take them towards Bridgwater, arriving on 24th February 2 days later. Then it was transport by truck to Cannington and their new home of Brymore House. They describe this as "an old mansion". Their new routine included hikes, meals of dried eggs, potatoes and carrots and illness. There were "plenty of cases of bronchitis and pneumonia during the first two weeks while we were getting toughened up for the weather".



Not really surprising coming from the hot deserts to a cold wet Cannington February and living in a tent.

Some of the troops explored Cannington and the book tells of an older couple inviting two of them into their home for a cup of tea. Unfortunately we don't have names, but the gentleman was a member of the Home Guard and had spent many evenings on watch on a nearby hill, armed with a piece of pipe. A further clue is that their son was in the RAF since the start of the war.

When the GI's were given a pass, Bridgwater was the place to go. Bridgwater is described as having old brick buildings each with a chimney and "four little tubes which the English called chimney pots". The blackout didn't stop the crowds in the evening. The pubs were described "as being a series of small rooms connected by a hallway and time was called at 10pm, but the GI's tried to extend that whenever possible.".

In March, the 535th went to Devon to The Assault Training Centre at Woolacombe. They practiced landing exercises using the landing crafts, waterproofing preparations for their equipment, mine clearance training and the expected types of first aid to be seen on an invasion.

Exercise Tiger included the 535th. This was a practice for the D-Day landings at Slapton Sands, south of Torquay. Unfortunately nine German U boats from Cherbourg came out to investigate. Three landing crafts were hit and many hundreds of men were killed. The landing crafts of the 535th were unscathed, but had a near miss.




In May, the final D-Day preparation was done. The vehicles were waterproofed and an upright tube was attached to the exhaust. The troops left as darkness fell. The men of the unit who were not going to be the first part of the invasion force, lined the Brymore drive to wave them off.

Once in camp at Torbay they had to hand over British money and were given leaflets about how to communicate in French. Eventually they were shown maps and where they were to land at Utah beach and when.

The 535th set sail out of Dartmouth, on 4th June and reached the Isle of Wight before D-Day was postponed and they had to return to try again the next day. The 535th landed in France sort of as planned, but the men on the islands off shore were

there much longer than expected and many of a group's belongings went down with a ship that sank. Some men landed without shoes or firearms or rations. They made do with items found on the beach or shared by other groups. After the grey day of the first invasion the weather improved and sun burn became a problem for the anti-aircraft battalion dug out holes.

The 535th fought through France and Belgium into Germany. After the German surrender they travelled back to the



Many of the villagers who remember the 535th here in Cannington were children at the time. They have personal memories of their meetings with the soldiers. Weather Report

January, in spite of six air frosts mid-month, was warmer than average. The daytime and nighttime averages were 9.4c and 3.2c. These figures were one degree higher than the January average. The rainfall totaled 44.8mm, some 30mm less than average. There were two wet spells. The first four days accounted for

23.4mm then 20mm fell from the 20th to the 25th. The remaining 1.4mm fell as a light shower on the last day of the month. Named storms Isha and Jocelyn brought us winds in excess of 30mph, far less than many other parts of the country.

February, internationally, was the warmest February on record. Our recordings go along with this. Daytime and nighttime

averages of 12.5c and 6.6c respectively were some four degrees higher than normal. There were no air frosts. Along with these very mild temperatures came a

lot of rain. We recorded 89.6mm which is 38mm more than average.

March continued with the trends set in February. It was much warmer than average. Daytime temperatures averaged 12.8c, about 1.5c above normal, the nighttime average of 5.6c was similarly above normal. It was another very wet month. We recorded 95mm, some 40mm over the long-term average. Some rain fell on 22 days.

The wettest day was the 27th when 14.6mm fell. It will be no surprise to know the running total for 2024, at 229.6mm, is also much more than we would have expected. **David Daggar**



scene was over a bit too quickly to really appreciate


the work that had been put into the costumes, props and scenery within it.

NEW BALLS, PLEASE

In the first half of the 20th century, tennis balls were usually white.

But in the 1960s, a young television producer called David Attenborough became the controller of BBC2 and began looking for new sports that worked well in colour. He liked the idea of tennis - especially as it could be filmed with just a couple of cameras.







Steve Pettitt, chair of CiB comments..."We are delighted to have been invited to compete in this year's Britain in Bloom competition. Cannington have been proud Gold medal winners in the regional South West in Bloom scheme and we are honoured to receive this recognition of all our Bloomers' hard work and dedication. Cannington in Bloom not only helps to make our village beautiful, but brings our community together, with shared ambitions for creating a more sustainable, supportive and caring place to live and work".

And we have BIG plans, some of which have already been actioned:

Cannington Parish Council have taken possession of a brand new water bowser, which with the help of a newly appointed water warden, will keep the village blooms looking their best throughout the spring and summer. We may still need help from village water wardens, but the bowser will be there to do the lion's share.

You may have noticed the elegant new grit bins – there's one at Clifford Park. Cannington in Bloom are working hard to enhance the village and this is particularly evident on the Clifford Park corner. One of our dedicated bloomers (Rowena) is leading a woodland wildlife project to encourage diversity in this area and you will soon see some bug hotels being built by a variety of community groups. Watch this space.

Further work has been carried out by the Community Payback team, clearing ivy from the walls opposite Brymore lodge, and in the next few weeks the village will be adorned with six new sustainable planters — purchased with a very generous donation from **Castle Hill Quarry**. These have water reservoirs and are made from recycled materials designed to last for many years. **RocketGro** have once again donated their amazing compost which really does what it says on the packet, so we hope to do Cannington proud this year.

Amazingly, the village has submitted five RHS 'It's Your Neighbourhood' entries this year, all lead by groups dedicated to bringing our community together and improving our environment.

The annual village garden and allotment competition is being brought in line with the Britain in Bloom entries and we should know the judging dates by the end of April.

School path has also been transformed by another dedicated bloomer (Ann) and if you have any spare Hellebores, she's very keen to plant some. Indeed, any plant donations are welcome.







Have you been looking after someone else's child for 28 days or more?

Do you know a child that's being looked after outside their close family?

If so, the child may be living in a private fostering arrangement.

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements. This is so we can make sure the children are well looked after and to give support to their carers.

What is private fostering?

Private fostering is when a child or young person under 16 years old - or under 18 if they have a disability - lives with someone for 28 days or more who is not a close relative, guardian or person with parental responsibility. A close relative would be a parent, step-parent, aunt, uncle or grandparent.

People become private foster carers for all sorts of reasons. They might be a friend of the child's family. They could be someone who is willing to look after a child they do not know, for example if that child is on an exchange trip or have parents who live overseas.

If Children's Social Care has made the arrangement, or the person who is caring for the child is and approved foster carer, this is not private fostering.

What to do if you know of a private fostering arrangement

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements.

If you think you are privately fostering a child or know about a child who is being privately fostered, then don't worry, it is allowed. But you do need to tell us - we have a legal duty to ensure that all children who are privately fostered are cared for in a safe and suitable environment.



Cathy's Recipe - Ho-Hum Pork Chops

6 Loin pork chops (Locally sourced from our butcher) Use your fingers to check for loose bits of bone and trim these off - Small handful of fat raisins (Best ones are from Health Food Stores) - 1 green pepper, sliced thinly and seeds removed - 3 cloves of garlic chopped 2 peeled and chopped apples (Bramleys are my favourite or any apple that goes fluffy when cooked) - 6 figs, soak dried ones overnight and chop (Available from Health Food Stores) 6 dates, remove stones and soak overnight and chop as figs - 125g (4oz) almonds cut into pieces, - 6 black peppercorns - 10 sliced, chopped mushrooms - 1 sliced shallot - 1 chopped onion

Method


Score fat on chops with scissors or sharp knife. Fry in vegan spread or unsalted butter on both sides on a fairly high heat until 'sealed' and golden. Place chops in slow cooker or casserole dish.

Fry garlic on low heat for one minute in vegan spread or unsalted butter. Add the garlic, one mug of water and the rest of ingredients to the pork.

Simmer for 15 minutes. Then add 1 teaspoon of sweet basil, 1 teaspoon savoury, 1 teaspoon thyme, half teaspoon salt, 8 grinds of black pepper, 4 drops of tabasco.

Simmer in low oven for two hours on Gas 4, 180 degrees or 6 - 8 hours in slow cooker. Serve with creamy mashed potato or butter beans and a green veg. Some fiddly ingredients but well worth it for the delicious thick sauce and tender, slightly sweet and sour tasting pork.

Gardens & Allotments - May - June - July 2024

May - Well this is the month of the Chelsea Flower Show 21st - 25th May; very arty and out of most of our reaches but loads and loads of ideas for the smallest veg/fruit plot and garden. Monty Don's 'Gardeners World' started in February again on Friday evenings, with an interesting feature showing real gardens from enthusiastic owners, something for everyone and his 'Spanish Gardens' is an inspirational and a feel good series. All these will be available on catch-up at BBC iPlayer.

Cannington has been rewarded with entry into Britain in Bloom. Only through all the hard work of Cannington in Bloom volunteers and those in the community that have supported this fantastic enterprise has this been possible. The theme is 'Kindness' so lots of initiatives are taking place in the community this year. Allotments will be asked to share their excess produce. See separate article by Cannington in Bloom on Pages 22/23 for details. Early this month, there will be still time to sow flower and vegetable seeds and plant seed potatoes. It had been virtually impossible due to rain, rain, rain and very little sunshine.



Tie in new shoots on clematis, continue successional sowing of salad crops and herbs. Sow cauliflower, leeks and sprouting broccoli for harvesting next winter. Earth up and create ridges over potatoes when the shoots are 20cm (8") high. Water brassicas well to encourage strong growth. Pinch out tips of broad beans to minimise and control blackfly.



At Whitsun plant out dahlias and canna lilies, Deadhead wallflowers and tulips. Ponds and water features, keep topped up. Clean pond filters. Use grills over ponds to protect children. Remove blanket weed and floating weeds as soon as they appear. Avoid feeding birds with peanuts that could choke fledglings. Keep bird baths clean and filled with fresh water. The majority of baby birds fledge around 25th of the month, so if it is

important to you, where possible keep cats in just for those few days. The Swifts, Swallows and House Martins that have flown from Africa will be collecting mud for nest building. Purpose built nest boxes high up on a sheltered or east facing wall is best or wooden soffits where the mud collected by these birds will stick.

June - 'Cannington Open Gardens' will be on Sunday 9th June beginning at 1pm. For full details see Page 34. Pruning - those plants that flower before mid-summer, cut flowers off after flowering. Those that flower after mid-summer, cut flowers off in winter. Water potatoes well once a week, in the evening. Tadpoles will be tiny frogs by now so watch where treading in the garden. Plant the following for bees; Rosemary, Mahonia, Perovskia, Lavender, Pulmonaria, Hardy Geranium, Sedum, Ribes (Flowering current), Majoram, Sunflowers, Nasturtium, Lupin and Catmint (Nepeta) and try and leave some Dandelions, bees need and love them.

July - Just enjoy your garden. Water in the evening. Deadhead. Hand weed. In April we had so many Ladybirds in our garden, which is good as they will devour the greenfly. Dig up and enjoy those delicious home grown potatoes.






