Why do we wear poppies?

It represents all those who lost their lives on active service, from the beginning of the First World War right up to present day.

It also honours the contribution of civilian services and the uniformed services which contribute to national peace and security and acknowledges innocent civilians who have lost their lives in conflict and acts of terrorism.

Are Poppies recyclable?

For the 2023 Poppy Appeal we introduced new plastic-free poppies alongside our remaining stocks of the current poppy of which there are still quite a lot. Plastic-free poppies can be recycled in ordinary paper recycling collections and poppies containing single use plastic can be returned to Sainsbury's stores for recycling.

DAVID'S QUARTERLY WEATHER REPORT

July brought us some lower than normal temperatures during the first week and the daily maximum did not reach 20c WEATHER until the 10th however a series of temperatures in the high twenties [29.3c on the 29th] ensured the monthly average of 21.7c exactly

matched the long term figure. Nighttime temperatures of 11.9c were very slightly lower than normal. Overall, it was a little drier than average. We recorded 46.4mm some 9mm less than we expect in July. After seven months we have recorded 385mm exactly matching the long-term yearly average. The second half of the month gave us only 7mm.

August continued with the dry weather of the last part of July. We recorded only 14.3mm during the month. This was less than a quarter of the long-term average. The wettest day was the 24th with only 5.2mm. An average daytime temperature of 23.2c was two degrees higher than normal enabling us to enjoy some nice holiday weather. The highest temperature was 29c on the 11th.

September 2024 broke records nationally for the amount of rain received,



so it is no surprise that we recorded a record amount too. Our 131.1mm is 10mm more than twice the local average. The two wettest days of the year so far were the 22nd and 23rd with 21.6mm and 29.6mm falling. The running total for the year is now 533mm, some 24mm over normal. Most of the rain fell in the first and last weeks with a pleasant dry

spell mid-month when high pressure dominated. Daytime and nighttime temperatures of 19c and 11.2c were not record breaking and matched the average almost exactly. **David Daggar**





LONDON, AUGUST 1924

EARTH TREMOR AND CLOUDBURST.

WEEK-END STORM HAVOC.

The storms of the past week caused very serious damage in the Bridgwater district of Somerset. At Cannington on Saturday a cloudburst occurred, and, it is stated, though the Meteorological Office have no official record, the rainfall registered during a period of six hours was 9.4 in. The water rushed through the streets like a tidal wave, flooding houses and drowning pigs and poultry. Telegraph poles and gates were borne along, and a stone wall was thrown over. The outlook for crops in West Somerset is very serious, and in the opinion of prominent local corn merchants the position will be disastrous if the ensuing week is similarly wet. No English grain was on offer at Taunton market on Saturday.

The History of Bridgwater Carnival

The origins of our annual carnival in Bridgwater can be traced back to the Gunpowder Plot of 1605 when Guy Fawkes failed in his attempt to blow up the houses of Parliament. That story is well known but what is not so well known is that James I decreed that the events of November 5^{th} should be commemorated annually with the lighting of bonfires a tradition which is celebrated across



lighting of bonfires, a tradition which is celebrated across the nation today. From journalistic records we can trace the development of our carnival from 1847, making it the oldest event of its kind in the UK and it was the Victorians who were instrumental in establishing the format of the carnival. Celebrations in those days concentrated around a huge bonfire that was built on the Cornhill and townsfolk paraded to the bonfire, many disguising themselves in costumes and masks, a practice which allowed them to get up to all sorts of harmless mischief!

However, it was the celebrations in 1880 which was to change the course of the carnival for ever. The evening started in good humour but this later gave way to ill temper and acts of violence leading ultimately to serious disorder and riot. The local authority decided enough was enough and called in the newly formed fire brigade to douse the flames. This angered the revellers to the extent that



they cut some of the hoses and the rest they turned onto the firemen themselves.

The next day the riot was the talk of the town and various parties were blamed and it took a letter from Frank Squire, written to the Bridgwater Mercury, to focus people's attention on the real issues. He suggested that a controlling committee be formed and an annual procession be organised so that

citizens in other parts of the town could witness the magnificent costumes which were a major feature in the festivities.

Frank's suggestion was well supported and in 1881 the first carnival committee was formed and the first official Bridgwater Guy Fawkes Carnival paraded through the streets leading to Bridgwater's title as the Home of Carnival.

A new town bridge was due to opened in the Autumn of 1883 and Capt. Ford

suggested that the official opening of the bridge should coincide with the Carnival parade and the committee decided to play their part by organising a baptism of fire when the parade reached the bridge. This consisted of a firework display of Roman Candles, Rockets and, of course, Bridgwater squibs.

Such a display would be expensive to stage so an Evening of Popular Entertainment was held in the Town Hall on 31st October and 14 guineas was raised,



more than enough to pay for the fireworks. So popular was this concert that it has been staged every year since (except for war years) and still remains a vital source of funding for the annual carnival parade itself.

The tradition of squibbing at the Bridgwater Carnival in Somerset, UK, dates back to at least 1716. The tradition is believed to have originated in the early 1600s and is a celebration of the failure of Guy Fawkes and his co-conspirators to blow up the Houses of Parliament on November 5, 1605.







South West in Bloom judging

At the time of writing the results for Britain in Bloom have not been announced and we are keeping our fingers crossed for similar results.

Pump Track

The pump track at Rodway has been a long time in planning and waiting for work to commence. But now, the pump track should soon be completed..

We are very fortunate to have this facility and it is only been possible by using the S106 Sports and Leisure Fund given to the Parish by EDF in mitigation for the building of Hinkley Point C. We would ask wherever possible you do

not drive to Rodway as there is very limited parking. It is used by EDF Mon - Fri.

Cannington Brook

We just managed to get the brook cleared around the main road bridge before the 30th September deadline. Apparently, the brook is a Salmonid water course and restrictions are put in place to when activities can take place in the brook.

We hope this now alleviates people's fears of flooding. A temporary fence has been erected along the brook in the children's play area and the bank will be reseeded.

20 mph

This is another scheme that is taking time to implement. We have been informed by Somerset Council that it should be completed by the end of the year.

Allotments

There is only a small waiting list at present and we are aware of a few allotments becoming available shortly. If you are interested in an allotment, please contact the Clerks for an application form.

Parking issues opposite the Spar shop

The parish council is doing all it can to address this problem. It has contacted all the relevant agencies for assistance and action, putting pressure on parking enforcement to visit more frequently to ticket vehicles. Included in the Highways Traffic Management Scheme planned work list is the installation of additional bollards on the pavement. This will happen, but sensibly, only once the Kings Head garage is knocked down; pressure is also being put on Punch Tavern to accelerate this work. Other suggestions included placing printed notes on vehicles encroaching on college land behind the gates (this has previously been suggested and rejected).

Jubilee Gardens

A new bench has been placed under the shade of the Hornbeam near the village information board. This has been donated by SPS (Somerset Passenger Solutions) in memory of past employees.

Private Fostering

Is your child living with another family?

Have you been looking after someone else's child for 28 days or more?

Do you know a child that's being looked after outside their close family?

If so, the child may be living in a private fostering arrangement.

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements. This is so we can make sure the children are well looked after and to give support to their carers.

What is private fostering?

Private fostering is when a child or young person under 16 years old - or under 18 if they have a disability - lives with someone for 28 days or more who is not a close relative, guardian or person with parental responsibility. A close relative would be a parent, step-parent, aunt, uncle or grandparent.

People become private foster carers for all sorts of reasons. They might be a friend of the child's family. They could be someone who is willing to look after a child they do not know, for example if that child is on an exchange trip or have parents who live overseas.

If Children's Social Care has made the arrangement, or the person who is caring for the child is and approved foster carer, this is not private fostering.

What to do if you know of a private fostering arrangement

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements.

If you think you are privately fostering a child or know about a child who is being privately fostered, then don't worry, it is allowed. But you do need to tell us - we have a legal duty to ensure that all children who are privately fostered are cared for in a safe and suitable environment.



Nov, Dec, Jan... Gardening Tips

November/December

Ensure old pumpkins from Halloween go in your food recycle bin as they are poisonous to hedgehogs, foxes, deer, birds and badgers if left in an open compost pile and they spread

disease. Remove yellowing leaves from sprouts, cabbages and all brassicas. Lift and store late-sown beetroot, carrots, turnips and swedes.

Check stored fruit and vegetables regularly and remove any that are damaged or rotted. Hand dig and manure heavy clay soil. Watch out for and do not disturb hibernating hedgehogs in hedges and long grass and under sheds if using machinery. We have hedgehogs in our allotments again this year. Sow broad beans & hardy peas. Plant garlic and rhubarb. Mulch raspberries not letting the manure touch the stems otherwise it causes rot.

Cover ponds with a net to catch autumn leaves, with a gap of half a metre near the slope for visiting wildlife, so they don't get caught in the netting. Remove the pond net in December. Weed any plants around your pond. Clean out any debrie and leave on the edge. In case of freet, leave or the

out any debris and leave on the edge. In case of frost, leave a rubber ball floating on the surface. Plant new trees like Crab Apple. This is perfect for small gardens as they

Plant new trees like Crab Apple. This is perfect for small gardens as they have small fruits for the birds, Autumn colour for next year and blossom for emerging insects in the spring.

Soak Sweet Pea seeds for a couple of days and plant in soil mixed with grit in a sheltered spot outside, they will provide cut flowers every week for the house. In fine weather divide perennials and mulch soil. Leave the garden a bit untidy. Insects hibernate and shelter in the hollow stems of Foxgloves. Ladybirds love a clump of parsley and butterflies overwinter in ivy, bottom of hedges, in leaves and long grass.

<u>January</u>

Place your seed orders. Prune dead, dying, damaged, diseased wood and any crossing inwards and rubbing other branches. Leave pruning of stone fruit until spring and summer. Try not to walk on your lawn when it is frosty as this damages the growth. *Catherine Nightingale 12.10.24*
