# THE ORIGINS OF NEW YEARS DAY FOOTBALL (NYDFC)

In 1983, Cannington FC was re-affiliated to the Bridgwater Sunday League for the 1983/84 season. Success was instant having gained promotion in the first season and a cup final appearance at Castlefields on Boxing Day (Bridgwater Town's old ground).

It was after this game a group of 'Old Boys' challenged the young Cannington team to a charity match which was to be played on New Years Day 1984. With the exception of two cancelled games, a match has taken place at the playing fields every year since. A countless number of locals, many who are no longer with us, have played and supported the event over the years helping to raise well over £50,000.

In 1995, the 'Den Lush Charity Shield' awarded to the player of the match was introduced giving the game additional impetus and a platform to grow. This led to the formation of the New Years Day Fundraising Committee (NYDFC) where other events have been subsequently organised including an annual golf tournament, a cricket match, ladies rounders, darts and eucre.

Various organisations and clubs have benefited from the events including the School, Church, Brownies & Cubs, Breast Cancer Research, the original Xmas lights in the jubilee gardens along with numerous village causes in need of a little help. One of the main beneficiaries has been the Childrens Hospice South West (CHSW) who have received a sum in the region of £40,000 over the past 20 years.

This years football game was incredibly well supported considering the awful weather. A total of £1,600 was raised on the day which includes donations made directly to the CHSW as a result of our football match. A cheque for £5,000 was presented to the CHSW at the Friendly Spirit who have kindly hosted the event for many years.

The reason the group is still going strong after 40+ years is the fundraising occasions provide an opportunity to get together and spend time with friends and like-minded people of our community. Everyone is welcome to join in.

Neil Lush and Colin Allen, who have been involved in organising the events from the beginning, would like to thank all of our supporters who have generously contributed not only their money, but their time and effort in making NYDFC a continued success.

# To stay warm in cold weather, you can:

- Prepare your vehicle: Remove snow and ice from your car, and check that your washer fluid is full.
- Dress appropriately: Wear warm, dry clothing and sturdy boots.
- Brake gently: If your wheels lock, ease off the brakes.
- Accelerate gradually: Use low revs and change gears quickly
- Be prepared: Keep an emergency kit with non-perishable food, water, and a torch.

Three children were left overjoyed after receiving 'the best Christmas present in the world' -bionic arms. Zoey Hampton-Pigeon, 8, Finn Jarvis, 11 and Ettie Baker, 8, were given their new 'life-changing' Hero Arms yesterday (12 December) thanks to The Big Hero 3 campaign.

The campaign, launched by mother Sarah Lockey, helps families of children

with missing limbs to fundraise for bionic arms.

The Open Bionics Foundation, which provides financial support to people who need multi-grip upper limb prosthetics, The Worshipful Company of The Glovers, Foresight Group and an anonymous donor had all contributed Ã40,000 towards the children's new bionic arms. The last Ã20,000 was raised by all three families working together and through the generosity and efforts of individuals and local communities holding a series of fund raising events the target was reached.

The last Ã20,000 has been raised by all three families working together. Finn's Dad, Ben, said: "Finn is a happy go lucky boy - he is kind, fearless and extremely switched on. He is now 11 and about to attend Brymore Academy secondary school - an agricultural school. With this opportunity of a Big Hero Arm the possibilities for him to excel are endless.

Finn has always been encouraged to see things as a challenge when his lack of limb has posed a problem. This he has always embraced and conquered, although at times having to compromise, where others have not had to. Finn is so excited to be given this opportunity and to see where and how this is going to change his life."

# BRIDGWATER TIDAL BARRIER

Creating a community resilient to flooding and coastal change



The Bridgwater Tidal Barrier scheme has been developed by the Environment Agency and Somerset Council due to the increasing tidal flood risk to Bridgwater town centre and the surrounding area. The scheme will deliver a tidal barrier and improvements to downstream defences on the River Parrett near Chilton Trinity, and will reduce tidal flood risk to 11,300 homes and 1,500 businesses.

### The whole scheme comprises:

- Constructing a tidal barrier on the River Parrett, next to Express Park, Bridgwater
- · Improving existing downstream riverside banks and constructing new secondary flood banks
- . Improving fish and eel passage at 12 upstream sites on the rivers Parrett and Tone

# **Parish Precept**

After increasing the precept last year by 25% councillors unanimously agreed not to increase it again this year. There will be a slight decrease in the parish precept you pay as there are more occupied homes in Cannington this year.



# **Pump Track**

The pump track has been very well used since it was completed last Autumn, which is very encouraging. There have been issues with parking at Rodway. From Monday to Friday, it is for the exclusive use of EDF as a park and ride facility for Cannington Court. Not only does it keep parked cars away from the centre of the village it also provides an annual income of £14,400 to the Parish Council which helps to keep our Precept at a low figure. The car park will now be left open at weekends for public use and will close on Sunday at 6.00pm in the winter and 9.00pm in the summer.

# **20** mph

The implementation of the 20mph limit hasn't gone to plan. At present there are both 20mph and 30mph signs on the same stretch of road and it is very confusing for motorists. Somerset Highways has been informed and they are shocked at the poor service provided by their contractor. These schemes should normally be carried out in one or two consecutive days. We are hoping it will be remedied as soon as possible.

# Children's Play Area

Last autumn the tunnel in the toddlers play area was vandalised and has been out of action. The cost to repair the tunnel is approximately £9,400. The Parish Council thought this was a lot of money for a tunnel and we are hoping to replace it with other equipment that might be more appreciated. We would like your ideas on the type of equipment you think your children would enjoy using. Please send your suggestions to the Clerks.

# Planning application 13/23/00032 for 160 dwellings off Brymore Way

The applicant has submitted new information and plans to Somerset Council for consideration. The Parish Council will be reviewing these plans and our decision will be made at our next meeting to be held on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> February in the Village Hall.

# **Cannington Neighbourhood Plan (NHP)**

The NHP is progressing through the stages. The Regulation 16 consultation has closed and the plan is now with an independent examiner. If all goes to plan the NHP should be going to referendum in May 2025.

# **Bleed kit**

The college has secured a bleed kit from the Avon and Somerset Bleed Kit Partnership and it is placed on the side of the High Street Bus Shelter next to the defibrillator.

These kits are easily accessible to help anyone respond quickly in life-threatening situations.

Our recent projects involved decorating the village bollards and the old phone box for Christmas and those who shop in Morrisons may have seen our Christmas post box topper.





#### First nuclear reactor for a generation is fitted to Hinkley Point C

We are pleased to share a significant milestone for our project as Hinkley Point C's reactor has been successfully installed.

This moment marks an important step in delivering the UK's first new nuclear power station in over 30 years and comes less than 12 months after the huge steel dome was lifted into place.



The "reactor pressure vessel" is a 500-tonne steel container that holds the nuclear fuel used to make heat that in turn produce steam for the world's largest turbine. The RPV was manufactured by Framatome in France, arrived at Hinkley Point C in February last year and has been in store until the installation. It will also be flanked by four 25m high steam generators due to be fitted next year.

In a precision operation that has been months in the making, the RPV was lifted onto rails and inserted through a

19.5m high equipment hatch, before being rotated by the large internal polar crane and lowered onto a support ring with just 40mm clearance on either side.

The installation marks another step forward in the fit out of the power station with equipment, including 360km of pipes and 10,000km of cable. Once operational, each unit will contribute significantly to the UK's energy security. The power station will help Britain achieve net-zero by providing enough reliable low-carbon electricity to power 6 million homes.



Energy Secretary Ed Miliband said:

"Installing the first reactor pressure vessel at Hinkley Point C is a significant feat of engineering and a major step forward for the UK's most advanced nuclear project. Getting Hinkley up and running to produce clean power for six million homes will be a win for our long-term energy independence, protecting bill payers as we accelerate to net zero."



#### What is private fostering?

Private fostering is when a child or young person under 16 years old - or under 18 if they have a disability - lives with someone for 28 days or more who is not a close relative, guardian or person with parental responsibility. A close relative would be a parent, step-parent, aunt,

People become private foster carers for all sorts of reasons. They might be a friend of the child's family. They could be someone who is willing to look after a child they do not know, for example if that child is on an exchange trip or have parents who live overseas.

If Children's Social Care has made the arrangement, or the person who is caring for the child is and approved foster carer, this is not private

#### What to do if you know of a private fostering arrangement

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements.

If you think you are privately fostering a child or know about a child who need to tell us - we have a legal duty to ensure that all children who are privately fostered are cared for in a safe and suitable environment.



#### Cathy's Gardening Tips

Recently Alan Titchmarsh extolled the virtues of gardening and how he loves the frost as a good frost kills pests and is an important part of plant dormancy. Like me he went for a walk on Christmas Day and just



loved the fact that it was so quiet with only the sounds of the various birds. He remembered seeing frost on the inside of his bedroom window and how beautiful the feathers of ice were in the sunlight and how lovely the bare branches of trees look. Seasonal weather at the right time of year has its place.

<u>February</u> brings snowdrops, lighter nights and preparations for spring. If you want to start an organic veg garden from scratch then pull up and hoe every weed. Then spread with 5cm (2") of compost. Where there are persistent weeds, lay thick, unprinted brown cardboard (with sellotape removed), over the weeds. Then add 10cm (4") of organic matter such as decomposed horse or cow manure. Ask our local farmers or stables, they may be able to supply some. Then sprinkle compost on top. It's Ok to start sowing seeds right away. With dense, persistent weeds,

including couch grass, spread with a thin layer of organic matter. Then cover with very, very thick black polythene (not the thin kind, as this becomes an environmental hazard when it breaks down). Or use weed suppressing fabric available from Monkton Elm Garden Centre near Taunton or try our local garden shop on Main Road. At Easter add another layer of



cardboard. In late May, see that the weeds have died then planting can start. If weeds are still there and are yellow or white, replace the cover and make holes to place your plants. Put organic seed potatoes on a window sill in egg boxes to chit. Soak Sweet Pea seeds for a week, then put 4 seeds to a small pot of seed compost (vermiculite, sharp sand, perlite and compost mixed). Sow marigold seeds.

<u>March</u> - Allow the grass, nettles & thistles to grow long in your scruffy corner; build a log pile. Scrub bird tables early in day with very weak disinfectant solution to protect from disease and bird flu. Clean out bird boxes. Bury some wood for stag beetle larvae. Keep bird baths



clean and filled daily with fresh water for the wild birds. Use a compost bin and fill with vegetable & fruit peelings, egg shells, coffee grounds, plastic free tea bags, pet rabbit & guinea pig waste. Sow your organic flower and vegetable seeds. Involve

your children and grandchildren to get the next generation inspired to garden.

April - Cut some bamboo into 5cm (4") pieces and slot together cut side showing, in your insect hotel. Leave out pine cones and straw. Place these at ground level for the spiders as they eat bees, but they do such a good job catching flies. First cut for grass keep blade high & go for longer grass on lawns to create world for beetles and insects. Even just mow a path, mower width around your patch. It will surprise you how many more insects and butterflies will visit your garden when the grass is left to grow. Install a water butt to a downpipe and hoeing and hand removal of annual weeds is a good investment of time as you don't give those weeds chance to set seed. Companion plant vegetables with herbs to encourage insects and pollinators for organic style gardening.



#### Cathy's Fluffy Omelette

#### **INGREDIENTS**

You will need a large, non-stick frying pan.

Non-stick fish slice & tongs. Cheese grater. Very large metal spoon. Hand whisk or Kenwood Chef with balloon whisk.

4 free range eggs separated. 75 g (2 oz.) unsalted butter/vegan spread.

6 brown mushrooms sliced (or frozen slices), fried lightly in butter. Pinch of salt. 6 grinds of black pepper. Half teaspoon turmeric. 250 g (80z) Medium Cheddar Cheese grated





#### **METHOD**

Beat the eggs whites in a large, clean fat free bowl until fluffy with stiff peaks. Pour into a separate clean bowl and put to one side for a minute or two. In the original egg white bowl, whisk the egg yolks until creamy and then add the seasonings. Pour out into a small bowl. Put the whisked egg whites back in the large bowl, pour over the egg yolks. Fold into the whites with the large spoon.

The next part all happens very quickly. Ensure you have hot dinner plates ready and everyone sitting down to eat.

Heat the butter in the frying pan until melted and frothy. Keep the heat/gas high. Pour in the egg mixture. Ensure it covers all the frying pan. Scrape the egg mixture with the tip of the tongs this makes sure that as soon as the egg touches the hot frying pan base it will cook. This stage takes two minutes. On one half of the omelette put the mushrooms, on the same half, add the grated cheese. Using the fish slice, flip the bare side over the cheese mixture and cut the omelette in half. Now carefully using the fish slice turn each portion over. Cook for 30 seconds. Flip out onto the heated plates. Serve immediately with watercress or a small side salad. Serves two. (Eggs continue cooking briefly after removing from heat.)

Omelette should be fluffy, cooked and oozing melted cheese. Delicious.

Alternatives: - Frozen, sliced mixed peppers, fried lightly in butter. One large red onion, chopped small. Fried tomatoes with sprinkle of demerara sugar, salt and pepper and drop of cider vinegar.

Many of us expect to stiffen up and feel less stable or strong as we get older. However, recent research shows that some of this can be avoided with exercise. We can even improve these signs of ageing, with specifically designed exercise programs. Muscle mass loss due to sarcopenia can be replaced with new muscle fibre formation with certain types of resistance training using leg weights or bands. Standing core work training and simple balance techniques can improve stability and over time reduce the risk of falls. Encouraging the gentle movement of the spine in different planes within in targeted classes, such as specialised Pilates or Yoga sessions, aids functional movement such as seeing behind us when driving or reaching for things off a shelf. Other benefits of this kind of structured exercise include the reduction of bone mass loss, mood improvement, 'muscle memory' gain prior to joint operations, improved flexibility and overall confidence to get around safely. #### The following extracts are from the Parish Council minutes 1900 - 1910

- The Parish council was formed in 1899 and took over the running of the village charities, the Almshouses and the cemetery.
- A complaint was received that the Sexton "did not attire himself suitably" when there were non-conformist or Catholic burials. He was duly reprimanded.
- An asphalt path was laid in the cemetery at a cost of £50 as no-one could be found to weed the path every two weeks.
- A light railway was proposed to run from Bridgwater to Stogursey and then Watchet.
- It was also proposed that Cannington should have it's own horse drawn fire engine, but high costs and lack of interest from large land-owners squashed the idea.
- The Parish Council organised celebrations for the coronation of King Edward VII and a sum of £6 14s 6½d was left and it was proposed to purchase 8 lamps to light the village from the bridge to the Rose and Crown. However, high maintenance costs made the idea uneconomical.
- A new road was proposed to avoid the Wembdon and Sandford hills.
- The County Council offered courses on gardening which was taken up by the village with an average class attendance of 46.
- The well halfway up Rodway was open and worries over cleanliness caused it to be covered over and a pump installed.
- The population of the village in 1901 was 1021
